## What to Look for in Paragraphs

- 1. General and specific
  - a. Galatians 5:16, 19-21a, 22-23
  - b. 1 Corinthians 13:1-12, 13.
- 2. Questions and Answers
  - a. Romans 6:1, 2
  - b. Mark 2:1-3:6 has 5 questions and 5 answers (1<sup>st</sup> four are asked by Pharisees and last by Jesus). 2:7→2:10; 2:16→2:17b; 2:18→2:19; 2:24→2:25,28; 3:4→Jesus answers with His actions, but they fail to answer His question. Mark also does this 5-question pattern in 11:27-12:40.
- 3. Dialogue
  - a. Who are the participants?
  - b. Who is speaking to whom?
  - c. What is the setting?
  - d. Are other people around?
  - e. Are they listening?
  - f. Are they participating in the dialogue?
  - g. Is the dialogue an argument? A discussion? A lecture? Friendly chitchat?
  - h. What is the point of the dialogue?
  - i. John 3
  - j. John 4
  - k. John 13:6-10
  - I. Habakkuk. (Not as easy to spot, but this is a dialog between God and His people.)
