Summarize each sentence in this paragraph into short phrases that still capture what is said.

Summarize the whole paragraph in this text into a sentence or two using those phrases.

#### **MEANING**

What does this text teach about God?

What does this text teach about people?

What does this text teach about relating to God?

What does this text teach about relating to people?

### **APPLICATION**

What does God want me to think/understand?

What does God want me to believe?
